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Letter from the Board

Greetings from the LEAP Foundation,

I have had the privilege of serving on the board of the LEAP Foundation since its inception in 2019. I met the DeKryger family and Belstra Milling through my position with the Indiana State Fair Commission. I believe in what they do and the ethical way in which they do it, so when they asked me to serve on the board I didn't hesitate to say yes.

I'm a city guy who grew up in Indianapolis with no connection to agriculture before coming to work at the Indiana State Fair 30 years ago. Through my decades of work at the Fair, I have developed a passion for Ag Education. At a time when less than 2% of the population actively works in production agriculture, and most people are four or more generations removed from the farm, I believe it is crucial that responsible producers provide consumers with the knowledge they need to make informed decisions about the food they eat. One of the reasons I agreed to serve on the LEAP Board was the shared belief in, and passion for, Ag education. In 2020, we were able to bring LEAP together with the Indiana State Fair to create a virtual school field trip program called "There's a Pig in My Classroom." The experience is targeted to kids in grades three through six and is built around a standards-based curriculum focused on pig production and food. The highlight of the experience is a live virtual connection to The Pig Adventure (Legacy Farms) at Fair Oaks. Kids step inside a working pig farm, learn from Ag professionals, and ask questions about pigs. It's an experience they can't get anywhere else.

When we started the program, we had one goal in mind, to educate school-aged children about pigs and pig production. We didn't know if the industry would support it, or if schools would sign up. Going into our fourth year, I think we can safely say the program has been a success. Since its launch, we have raised more than \$410,000 allowing 46,185 students in 35 states and Puerto Rico to participate in the program free of charge. Because of the support from our donors, this program has exposed children across the country to pig production for free. Removing the financial constraints that often impede field trip participation has made this program accessible to everyone. And in 2024, thanks to a partnership with the Department of Defense Education Activity, we are taking the program international.

I cannot thank you enough for supporting LEAP and the work we are doing to educate consumers about pigs. Our work would not be possible without you.




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There's a Pig in My Classroom

Program Updates

This has been a year of growth as we are now in 35 states across the country. Additionally we began working internationally because of our new connection with the Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA). We reached military classrooms in 4 different countries including Japan, South Korea, Germany, and Bahrain. In 2024, we plan on expanding our reach as we develop a high school aged curriculum in addition to our elementary field trip.

First Fruit Gives



Blessing Bags, a First Fruits Gives ministry, was created out of a desire to ensure that no child would suffer from hunger or worry over food insecurities. Our goal is to make sure that no child will have to worry over where their next meal will come from. Our team is working with full hearts and open hands to help each child and family in our school, and in our community, feel included and cared for. This is done through pre-made meals, food stuffs, toiletries, gifts at Christmas, and supplying back to school items each fall. Currently, we operate a free store open every Friday to supplement food needs over the weekends for 66 families in our community. We pack fresh, healthy, and fun meals and snacks to fill in the gaps. Our 20 acre farm is producing eggs



from chickens, Hogs, Angus Beef, Turkeys, and meat chickens to ensure our families have quality meats to eat and cook with. We have over 3,000 linear feet of vegetable gardens, a fruit tree orchard, and Strawberry and Blueberry patches that all produce fresh and healthy options in the growing season.

We are a non-profit organization, and no one takes a salary from the Farm. Every dollar and donation that comes in, goes right back out to the community and those we serve. The best of what we produce, the First Fruits, are given away to our families every week. We then sell our items to offset costs, and finally, we can preserve what isn't taken or sold to be cooked throughout the year.

The hogs that LEAP donates go to feed our families and offset the costs of raising and butchering them. Last year, one hog was used in a hog roast at a community FUN-raiser. We had a barn dance and just enjoyed the Farm atmosphere while learning line dancing. We can't wait to do this again this summer! Two hogs were butchered and are in the freezers for our families to take weekly and for us to cook for them with. Last Easter, we were able to give each family a ham or ham steak for their family Holiday meal. The other two hogs are for sale to the public. This helps offset costs on the farm.

We are so excited to partner with LEAP this year! We have been so blessed and have learned so much. It's wonderful for the families we serve to have their needs met with healthy and quality cuts of meat. They also enjoy seeing the animals and giving them treats as they grow!

Lilly Endowment Grant

Leading Education About Pigs Inc also known at the LEAP Foundation was competitively awarded a grant of \$150,000 from Lilly Endowment Inc. to assist with the development and growth in LEAP's live virtual field trip, "There's a Pig in My Classroom".

The program is being funded through Lilly Endowment's initiative, Strengthening Youth Programs in Indiana. The aim of the competitive initiative is to help youth-serving organizations working throughout Indiana improve their abilities to promote the academic, physical and social well-being of young people, ages five through 18. Leading Education About Pigs (LEAP) Foundation provides an interactive and virtual field trip, "There's a Pig in my Classroom," to elementary students who want to learn how food gets from farm to table at no cost to the school or students. With this grant, we plan to extend the reach of our live virtual field trip to more students across Indiana. Most importantly, students in Indiana's metropolitan areas who may not have access to farming/nutritional education will now have access to the program.

Future goals include the development of a middle/high school virtual field trip and an educational video which teaches students about how pigs are raised and how pork is produced. This video can be utilized by teachers at any time no matter the time zone.

"We are extremely excited and honored to receive this grant from Lilly Endowment" said Nick DeKryger, President of LEAP Foundation,. "This grant will greatly improve our efforts of teaching kids about agriculture and pig production in a unique and non-formal approach. The need for agricultural education is more important than ever and we are grateful for the support from Lilly Endowment to help us meet those needs."


